All hearings begin with a 30-minute open house. A formal presentation will follow after which there will be a public testimony period, when comments and opinions are entered into the public record one person at a time. Study team members will be available to discuss the project and answer questions during the open house and after the public comment period.

These public hearings are being conducted to give interested persons an opportunity to express their views concerning the location, conceptual design, and social, economic, environmental effects of the proposed improvements and in accordance with Federal Executive Orders 11990 and 11988.

The SFECC Study seeks to provide new regional and local passenger service to improve north-south mobility in Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach Counties along an 85-mile segment of the Florida East Coast Railway between downtown Miami to Jupiter.

An Alternatives Analysis Report, drafted by the Department, presents a short-list of transit alternatives for potential implementation along the corridor. The draft Alternative Analysis Report will be available for review between Monday, August 24, and Saturday, October 2, 2010, at the following locations and on the study's website, [www.SFECCStudy.com](http://www.SFECCStudy.com).
